3. Priorities for Involvement	Martin Quinn introduced the agenda item.
invoivement	The Forum continues to be a key vehicle through which the PHA exercises much of its leadership in the field of Involvement, Co-Production and Partnership Working. MQ shared the following key priority areas that the PPI team have identified for the next 2/3 years and welcomed any comments and suggestions from members.
	 Strategic leadership, advice and guidance - A core function of the PHA PPI team is the provision of professional advice, support and guidance on Involvement, on strategic, high profile, sensitive, cross organisational issues/projects. The support provided varies, but in the main entails:
	 The provision of professional Involvement advice and guidance, stakeholder analysis and development of Involvement plans. Practical support in helping the project promoter to identify, secure and facilitate service users and carers participation.
	 Development of monitoring arrangements. Identification and sharing of best practice.
	 Involvement training - The PHA commissions, designs, delivers and promotes Involvement, Co- Production and Partnership Working training opportunities for HSC staff, service users and carers and Community and Voluntary sector colleagues.
	 Training programmes include: Leading in Partnership, which is now in its 8th cohort. Bespoke webinar series, which is now in its 5th
	cohort and is delivered in partnership with The Consultation Institute.

	 Bespoke Involvement and Co-Production training delivered to various organisations across the HSC and beyond.
	 Monitoring – In partnership with Trust colleagues and Forum members, the PHA PPI Team have successfully re-introduced a revised Involvement monitoring system across the HSC Trusts. This approach to monitoring will further support the HSC to:
	 Evidence their compliance with the statutory duty to involve, Demonstrate how policy commitments to PPI and Co- Production are being met, Identify areas which could benefit from improvement. Help to share best practice.
	4. Support for partnership working for people with lived and living experience in the HSC - A key role of the PHA PPI team is supporting the HSC to advance the concept and practice of engagement, support and where appropriate, the remuneration of people with lived and living experience, as partners in the HSC. This is in line with the direction of travel set out in the Co-Production Guide. Working in partnership with the Patient Client Council (PCC) and service users and carers, we have been steadily building and progressing work to deliver on this matter.
	 A circular on reimbursement has been developed and issued by DoH. Draft regional guidelines for remuneration have been developed. Pilot sites have been identified and agreed to test the indictive model for remuneration.

	 The pilots will be evaluated to inform the further advancement of the concept and practice of remuneration.
	Another key piece of strategic work is advancing Shared Decision Making (SDM). In a Circular from the DoH, the PHA have also been designated a joint lead organisation, with SPPG, in the oversight, implementation and monitoring of the new NICE Clinical Guidelines NG197.
	SDM promotes ways for healthcare professionals and people using services to work together to make decisions about treatment and care. It includes recommendations on training, communicating risks, benefits and consequences, using decision aids, and how to embed SDM in organisational culture and practices.
	Members welcomed the PHA sharing their identified priorities for Involvement. MQ invited members to reflect on these and to either feedback their views or identify what they believed should be system wide priorities.
	Maria Somerville (MS) highlighted the issue around the accessibility some SUC have when trying to attend training sessions. The full day sessions are generally difficult for carers to attend due to having limited capacity. Training should be co-designed with SUC's and they should also be involved its delivery

	 Monthly competitions re-introduced in each leisure centre from Jan 23.
	 Further engagement planned at Celebration & Feedback events in June 23.
